**THIS WEEK** we will be looking at the story of Joseph (Genesis 37; 39-45). Joseph faced lots of tough situations in his life, but he never stopped trusting God. The Lord turned each of Joseph's struggles into blessings, and Joseph joyfully became a blessing and a role model to those who caused him harm.

**PARENTS:** In the story we are exploring today, Joseph's brothers sell him into slavery. Many years later there is a famine in the land and Joseph has the power to get even with his brothers by restricting them from receiving rations. **Ask your children what Joseph does and why.** (hint: Genesis 45:5-8)

### **Gift Card program**

This program gives you the opportunity to purchase gift cards from Zion for a large number of retailers. You purchase the cards at face value and Zion earns rebates with amounts varying from 2-7 %. These cards can be used for your own every day needs such as groceries, gas and are great gifts not just at Christmas but for all special occasions as well. We hold a bulk supply of a large number of retailers and cards for many other companies may be special ordered. Cards ordered by 9:30 on Monday will be available by Thursday. Cards may be paid for by cash cheques or debit cards. Visa and MasterCard may be used but this reduces the rebate by 1.75%. We appreciate the participation of the individuals presently using this program and would encourage other members of the congregation to take part in this ongoing fundraiser.
